2023-2024 Special Education Services and Supports – Updates

Moosonee Public School Overview:

- IPRC meetings scheduled for May, NLSS staff will be invited to IPRC meetings of students in grade 8 that will be entering grade 9 in the f2024-2025 school year
- 10 students had Education Psychologist assessments completed the first week of April during Parnell Psychologist (team of 3) were on-site in Moosonee
- 2024-2025 will be the final year for the Partners 4 Change (P4C) initiative at MPS to support OT services in schools, initiative has shown there is a need for Therapy Assistants in schools and has been identified as a promising practice

Northern Lights Secondary School:

- 5 students had Education Psychologist assessments completed the first week of April during Parnell
 Psychologist (team of 3) were on-site in Moosonee, and plans are in place to finish up a few more
 assessments virtually
- 44 students are on IEP's and being supported in second semester, with a couple of IPRC's needing to be completed on new students
- SERTS and Student Success Team supporting pathways to graduating and assisting IEP identified student needs

 Literacy and Numeracy lunch-time tutoring program is taking place every day to better support student in being successful in their courses

Professional Development

- Series of Wednesday afterschool workshops hosted by SERT @ MPS open to all education staff on the following topics:
 - Autism
 - FASD (Fetal Alcohol Syndrome Disorder)
 - LD (Learning Disabilities)
 - IEP's (Individual Education Plans)
- HANDS School Support Worker hosted virtual sessions over 8-week cycle for Education Assistants
- Literacy, Numeracy and Special Education Staff attended IDA conference, very informative
- NLSS had 2 staff members completed their Special Education Part 2 qualifications, and MPS had 1 staff
 complete their Sp. Ed. Part 1 qualification, 1 staff complete their Sp. Ed. Part 2 qualification and 1 staff
 complete their Sp. Ed. Specialist qualification utilizing the Ministry of Education Special Education AQ course
 subsidies for teachers during the 2023-2024 school year
